JOB SUMMARY

The Field Technician position is responsible for conducting field work related to field assessment, layout, development, monitoring, reporting and stewardship of the land within the Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Traditional Territory within a team environment, shadowing the Natural Resources Manager.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Fuel Reduction projects within Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation territorial lands.
- Environmental studies within Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Territorial lands. Field Monitor of various contracts and projects within Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Traditional Territory
- Conducting surveys and data collection within Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Traditional Territory.
- Layout and Development of Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation lands and projects.
- CSO Monitoring within the Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Traditional Territory
- Monitor and report any illegal activity (i.e.: dumping) within the Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Traditional Territory
- Monitor and report any significant water issues or threats (i.e.: water levels, quality, culverts, washouts) within the Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Traditional Territory
- Review of Range Use Plans on larger plan of monitoring activities and reporting on land and water license issues.
- Interviewing community members on current and historical resource use within Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Traditional Territory
- Monitor and report all hunting activities within the Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Traditional Territory
- Record all Species at Risk (SAR) if identified in the field within the Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation Traditional Territory
- Ability To Recognize Cultural Modified sites and items
- Other duties as assigned.
